Dear East Gates partner,

We enter 2019 with great hope and anticipation of what God will continue to do through East Gates for the eternal welfare of our Chinese brothers and sisters as they minister to each other, their nation and the world.

As we see in the life of Yeshua (Jesus), true ministry is not about doing something "new" at every twist and turn but learning how to be consistent, obedient and faithful under the loving authority of the Almighty who intimately knows the history of every nation, tongue and tribe.

As we've seen in the news, 2018 finished with US-China relations at an all-time low as on-going trade wars, China's growing military presence in the South China Sea and the U.S.'s request for the extradition of Sabrina Meng Wanzhou (CFO to China's largest telecom company, *Huawei*) for fraud and breaking American sanctions with Iran continued to erode any trust and hope for better East-West relations.

Throughout history, whenever Sino-American relations did not fair well, indigenous Christians were always affected. One of the main reasons is because China always viewed Christianity as a "Western religion" with geopolitical and socioeconomic objectives that did not have the "Middle Kingdom's" best interests in mind. China, with its 3,500-4,000 years of recorded history versus America's 240, remembers well events like the Taiping Rebellion (1850-1864) in which Christian tenets (albeit properly or improperly expressed) came head to head with a corrupt and dying Qing dynasty. The bitter taste of the Boxer Rebellion (1899-1901) still lingers as well for it was a time when anti-foreign, anti-colonial and anti-Christian sentiments ran high. In the end, the Chinese government felt shamed in a way they've never forgotten.

So directly and indirectly, these major rebellions affected the central government's stance on religion, especially the Christian faith since from an overall historical perspective, Christianity always seemed to be one aspect of Western culture that threatened China's national security and ideologies. The irony is, in March 2017, China printed its 160 millionth Bible of which half have been exported to over 100 countries. It reminds of us of what the Anglican theologian Bishop Hanley Moule (1841-1920) once wrote:

There is no situation so chaotic that God cannot, from that situation, create something that is surpassingly good.



He did it at Creation.



He did it at the Cross.



He is doing it today.

In 2017, the American Christian publishing company, Crossway Books, the United Bible Society and China's National Chinese Christian Council / Three-Self Patriotic Movement worked closely together to publish a new Chinese Study Bible (ESV version). On the first day of its release, 6,500 sold immediately. Since that time, the stock has been sparse. Recently, however, our Project Director, discovered there were several cases at one of the Bible distribution centers so he bought the remaining 250 copies and had them sent to pastors and Bible teachers in Shandong, Zhejiang, Yunnan and Shaanxi provinces.

Outside of the Life Application Bible, there are few if any Chinese Study Bibles. This one has received great reviews because for the first time, pastors and believers say this version has explanatory notes, maps and charts that tie scriptural meanings to their standard Chinese Union Bible version. They now have a greater sense of the culture, times and context in which the Bible was written.

One of our long-time Bible missionary teachers shared, "Given the increasing tension that surrounds us, it has become more difficult to have large gatherings. We've had to increase the number of co-workers to oversee smaller cell groups. This means they require better training so the Study Bible has been a great tool. It answers a lot of the questions the students have. We really appreciate this gift with a grateful heart and will remember you when we thank the Lord!"
