Dear East Gates partner,

Springtime is a season of new beginnings and revelations about what God is doing in heaven and on earth. Throughout creation, we see the pattern of death and resurrection; going to sleep and waking up to new life; coming out of darkness and into the light. We connect to the Source and purpose of this reality through the annual celebration of Passover and Easter.

Most of us know the account surrounding Passover. The Israelites were in Egyptian bondage for around 400 years. The Hebrew word for Egypt is *mitzrayim*. It means "narrowness" and "constriction." Literally, the Israelites were oppressed and repressed for centuries in a place they could hardly breathe. Finally, they cried out to God (Exodus 3:9). God heard and He made a way for them to escape this spiritual and physical prison by parting the Red Sea (like a birth canal) into a wide and open place. Here they would be able to worship their One and only true God who would love them to Life, not death.

The ultimate expression of God's love is when He chose to step outside of His eternal and limitless domain into a realm of immense constriction which He Himself designed -- the womb and human body. From there, He took upon a world based on free choice which He freely granted. Inevitably this involved sin which leads to death but He provided the only solution. Our Creator, Jesus or Yeshua (Hebrew for *salvation*), sinless and unblemished, became our sin-offering to redeem us.

On the Cross, Yeshua revealed how our "temple" was not created to die but live forever. Like the Red Sea that parted and the thick Temple curtain that tore from top to bottom, when our Savior died, it was if the Throne Room doors flung open in the heavenly realm. We now had FULL access to the inner sanctum of the Holy of Holies and to Him. Prayer would now be our sacrifice.

The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; A broken and a contrite heart, O God, You will not despise. *Psalms 51:17*




BEHOLD, I AM DOING A NEW THING! ISAIAH 43:19


